



**Position: Wildlife Specialist**

The Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Centre (A/OFRC) is a not-for-profit corporation established by agreement between the Grand Council Chief of the Anishinabek Nation and the Ontario Minister of Natural Resources and Forestry to further the knowledge and conservation of resources of interest to member First Nations and Ontario's stakeholders. The Centre is in the process of revising its mandate to address resource questions beyond its original focus on fisheries.

The A/OFRC is seeking an experienced wildlife specialist with demonstrated field experience for a contract of approximately two years duration. The successful candidate will be responsible for developing a system for managing information about moose populations, including moose harvest reporting and population status, archiving, analyzing and reporting. This temporary, full-time position will be based out of Biigtigong Nishnaabeg First Nation near Marathon Ontario, and will involve travel within the Biigtigong Nishnaabeg territory and to the Centre's headquarters in North Bay, Ontario.

**Salary:**

Wildlife Specialist: \$55k p.a., 37.5 hr. week

**Qualifications (Wildlife Specialist):**

- Graduation from a university of recognized standing with a degree in biology or the social sciences in a natural resource oriented field
- Experience completing wildlife assessment and/or harvest reporting projects
- Understanding of database applications and quantitative techniques
- Proven leadership and organizational skills
- Knowledge of and sensitivity to First Nation culture; knowledge of the history, culture or language of First Nations comprising the Anishinabek Nation would be an asset
- Valid MOT driver's license and acceptable driver's abstract

*Given the traditional practices of the Anishinabek, exposure to wood smoke and the burning of sacred medicines, including tobacco, sweet grass, sage or cedar, may occur within the work setting.*
