Peer reviewed and published science has demonstrated the occurrence of disease transmission from domestic sheep and goats to wild sheep has had a huge negative effect on wild sheep populations.

Through this issue statement CSTWS supports all management efforts in Canadian jurisdictions that will prevent disease transmission by maintaining appropriate separation of wild sheep and domestic sheep and goats as recommended in the issue statement.
